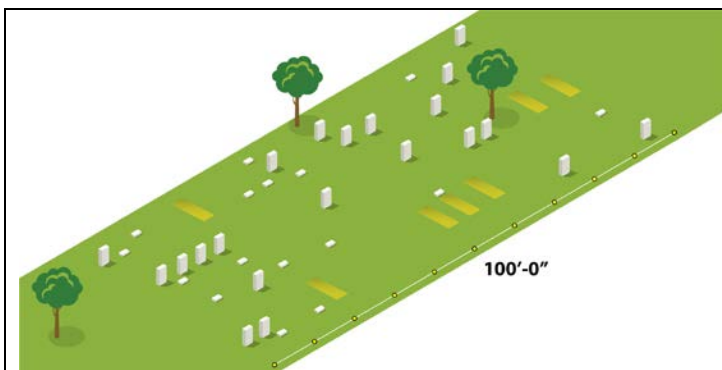

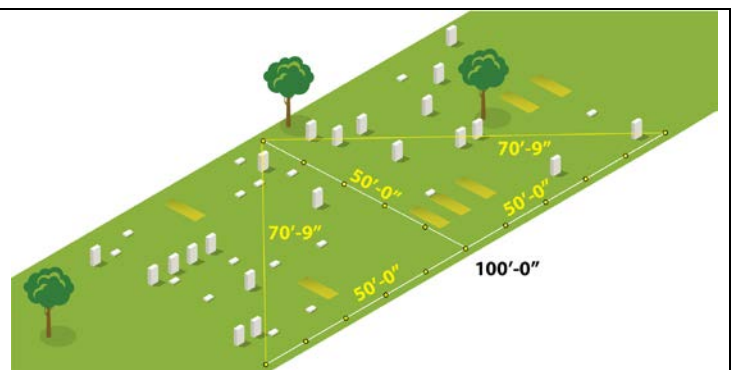

The Process: Who, What, Where, and How

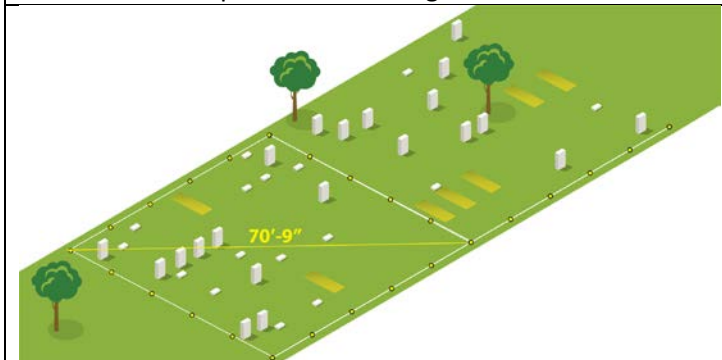

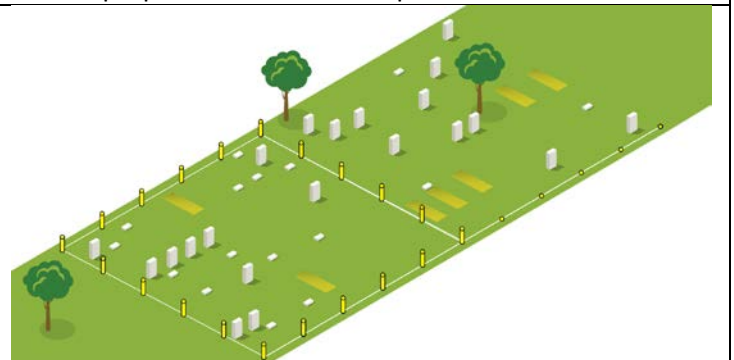
Set a 100-foot rope oriented with gravestones



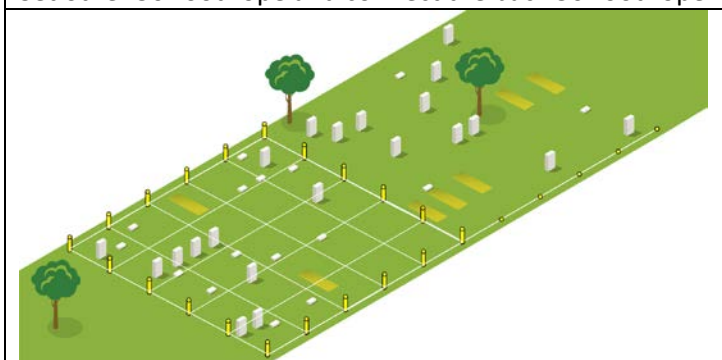
Set the perpendicular 50-foot rope



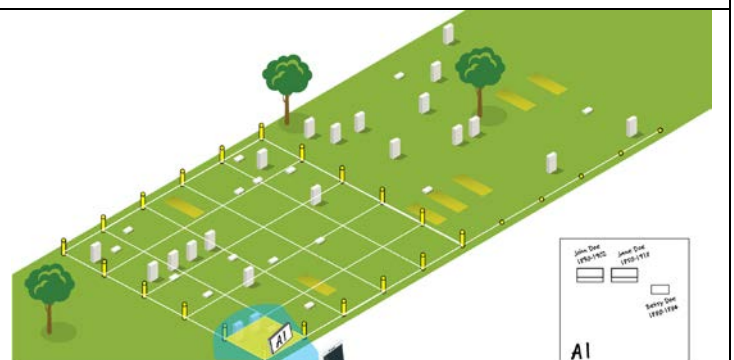
Set other 50-foot rope and connect the back 50-foot rope



Place the 10-foot rods

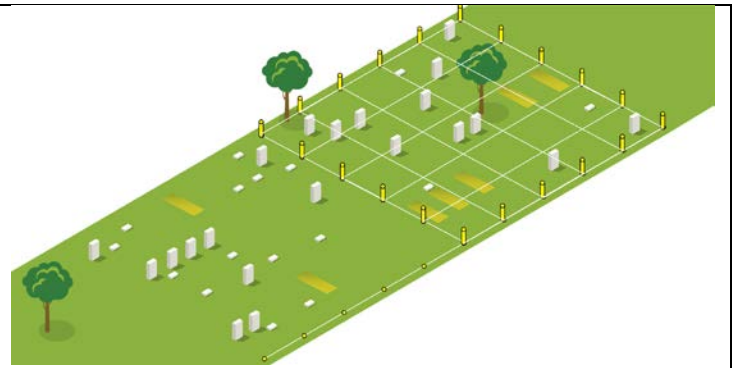
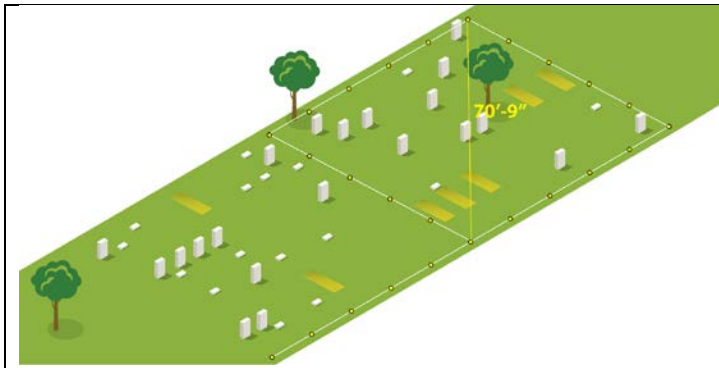


String the grid with long ropes



Photograph each grid square and draw the markers

Repeat this process to photograph and draw each grid square.



Reset for other half of area

Set rods and grid rope to photograph and draw
